Former mayor gets N.J. position

WOODBURY The former mayor of National Park has been reappointed by the freeholders to represent the county on the New Jersey Pinelands Commission.

Francis A. Witt was given a new three-year appointment on the commission during the freeholders' annual reorganization meeting.

The commission consists of 15 members seven appointed by the governor, one representative from each of the seven counties that lie within the New Jersey Pinelands and one appointed by the Secretary of the Interior.

Witt, partner in the Cherry Hill firm of Joseph F. McKernan Architects and Associated, has been on the commission since 2004.

The commission's role is to preserve, protect and enhance the resources of the Pinelands National Reserve which includes portions of Franklin and Monroe townships.

Other appointments made by the freeholders during reorganization include:

Nick L. Petroni of Glassboro as auditor at an annual stipend ranging up to \$100,000.

The Marlton-based law firm of Parker McCay as bond counsel at a stipend ranging up to \$240,000.

The Haddon Township-based law firm of Brown and Connery as labor attorney at a stipend ranging up to \$400,000.

Theodore Miller and Joseph Conboy to four-year terms on the Gloucester County Construction Board of Appeals. The freeholders also designated Robert DeAngelo as chairman and Jeanne Giampola as secretary.

Nancy Reiter, Maxine Bagley, Karen Dickel and Maria Winstead to three-year terms on the Gloucester County Commission on Women.

Robert Curtis, William Carpinelli, Thomas Bianco, Thomas Huffnel, John Darkalis, David Cornell, Mario Christina, John Margie and Philip Tartaglione to the Gloucester County Parks and Recreation Advisory Council.
