### HERBACEOUS / PERENNIALS

**Scientific Name:** *Adiantum pedatum*

**Common Name:** Maidenhair fern

**Container Size:** #2 1-3'

**Price:** \$15.00

**Description:** Ground cover fern. Up to 2'5 high and 1.5' wide. Love moist shady areas of the garden, perfect for plating along edges with low sunlight. Prefers acidic/neutral soils but thrives in all regions in NJ. Pink fiddleheads in spring, bright green in summer. **Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens Periphery.**

**Scientific Name:** *Andropogon gerardii*

**Common Name:** Big Bluestem

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Common perennial of open sites. 4'-6' high. Upland, dry sites with acidic soils Full sun to partial shade. Flowers mid-August to late September. **Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.**

**Scientific Name:** *Andropogon virginicus*

**Common Name:** Broomsedge Bluestem

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Common species of dry, open sites. Like Little Bluestem, but leafier and stouter flowers tucked inside bracts. 2'-5' high. Upland, dry sites. Semi-shade. Attracts birds and butterflies. Flowers mid-August to late September. **Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.**

**Scientific Name:** *Asclepias incarnata*

**Common Name:** Swamp Milkweed

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Large blossoms of small, fragrant, upturned rose-purple flowers. Great host plant for Monarch butterflies and hummingbirds. Great for rain gardens and habitat. 2'-6' tall. Moist to wet soils; sun to part shade. Can thrive in mucky clay soils. Blooms June through October.

**Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens Periphery.**

**Scientific Name:** *Baptisia tinctoria*

**Common Name:** Yellow Wild Indigo

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Great for native bees and bumblebees. The plant is a host to many local butterfly larvae. Has a small pea-like flower that blooms in May-June. Perfect for sunny areas and as a staple in a butterfly/pollinator garden. Prefers acidic/neutral soils but thrives in all regions in NJ **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Coreopsis lanceolata*

**Common Name:** Lanceleaf tickseed

**Container Size:** #2 1-3'

**Price:** \$15.00

**Description:** Sun loving perennial with yellow daisy-like flowers. Drought tolerant, does better in well drained sandy or rocky soils. Begins blooming in May-July and flowers provide food for late summer insects and birds. Plant may be trimmed or divided as they grow. Perfect to form masses of pollinator flowers and meadows. Grows best in full sun but will tolerate shade. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Coreopsis rosea*

**Common Name:** Pink Threadleaf Tickseed

**Container Size:** #2 1-3'

**Price:** \$15.00

**Description:** Sun loving clumping perennial with small pink/purplish daisy-like flowers. Does not tolerate drought very well, prefers moist sandy. . Begins blooming in May and continues into early fall, flowers provide food for late summer/early fall insects and birds. Plant may form dense ground cover. Perfect for moist areas of the garden. Grows best in full sun but will tolerate shade. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Echinacea purpurea*

**Common Name:** Purple Coneflower

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** The popular butterfly magnet. Seeds provide food for goldfinches. 3'-4' tall with pink-purple flowers that bloom from June through September. Medium to dry soils; full sun to part shade. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Eragrostis spectabilis*

**Common Name:** Purple Love Grass

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Warm-season grass with small reddish-purple flowers that blooms in July-August. Dried flowers can be used for fall flower arrangements. Flowers are attractive to bees and butterflies. Does better in hot, dry, full sun conditions. Does not tolerate wet sites or shade. Perfect for butterfly gardens and wildlife habitat areas. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Eupatorium hyssopifolium*

**Common Name:** Hyssop-leaved Thoroughwort

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Perennial with narrow leaves, growing in whorls of three or four around the stem, white flowers bloom in late July to October, forming nice bunches at top. Prefers dry open areas with sandy soils and good drainage. Flowers are attractive to bees and butterflies.

**Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Eupatorium purpureum*

**Common Name:** Purple Joe-Pye

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Wildflower of moist woods & meadows with whorled leaves & dome-shaped clusters of pink flowers. 4-6'. Prefers damp soils. Flowers late July to October. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Euthamia graminifolia*

**Common Name:** Flat-top Goldenrod

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Blooms in late summer with a flat cluster on yellow flowers sitting on top of this herbaceous perennial. Prefers full sun and moist soil but can tolerate drought conditions. Up to 3' tall and less susceptible to powdery mildew than some other species of golden rods. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Gentiana sp*

**Common Name:** Blue gentian

**Container Size:** #2 1-3'

**Price:** \$15.00

**Description:** A cultivated variety of our beloved gentian. Striking blue flowers that are usually pollinated by bumblebees who are strong enough to push their way through the petals and open the flowers. Blooms in August and September and dies good in all types of soils in New Jersey. Prefers partial sun, but tolerates full/indirect sun in cool areas.. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Helenium autumnale*

**Common Name:** Sneezeweed

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** A perennial plant in the daisy/aster family of moist meadows with small but showy yellow flowers. Hardy and spreading. Food source for birds and insects, blooms July-August. Full sun to part shade. Perfect for wildflower and pollinator gardens. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Helianthus angustifolus*

**Common Name:** Swamp Sunflower

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** A perennial sunflower of wet meadow with showy yellow flowers. Hardy and spreading. Food source for birds and insects. 3'-4' tall, late bloomers that will ensure you still have color and food for birds all the way until early November. Prefers organic, sandy and acidic/pH neutral soils. Perfect for rain gardens, areas that collect water, and the edges of ponds. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Heliopsis heliantoides*

**Common Name:** False Sunflower

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Container Size:** #3 3-4'

**Price:** \$15

**Description:** A perennial sunflower of wet meadow with showy yellow flowers, also known as Smooth Oxeye. Hardy and spreading. Food source for birds and insects. 3'-4' tall, like other sunflower/daisies, it blooms in late summer. Prefers organic, sandy and acidic/pH neutral soils. Perfect for rain gardens, and for regular flower beds and wildflower/pollinator gardens. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Iris versicolor*

**Common Name:** Blueflag Iris

**Container Size:** #2 1-3'

**Price:** \$15.00

**Description:** This iris has attractive blue to purple flowers and blooms May - July. From 2' to 3' tall. Grows in medium to wet soils in full sun to partial shade. Can grow in 2"-4" in shallow standing water. Does best in full sun and moist, rich soils. Will spread by self-seeding and extension of rhizomes. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Liatris spicata*

**Common Name:** Dense Blazing Star

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Slender, erect perennial that reaches a height of 3'-4'. A dense spike of purple flowers appears July - September. Likes full sun but can tolerate partial shade. Grows best in moist, acidic sandy soil. Attractive to bees, hummingbirds and butterflies. Low maintenance plant that may be resistant to deer. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Lobelia cardinalis*

**Common Name:** Cardinal Flower

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Herb of wetlands with striking, bright red flowers & toothed alternate leaves. Flowers May - October. Attracts hummingbirds. To 5' tall. Needs wet or moist soil and likes sun, partial shade or shade. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific name:** *Monarda dydima*

**Common Name:** Scarlet Beebalm

**Container Size:** #2 1-3'

**Price:** \$15.00

**Description:** Cultivated variety (powdery mildew resistant) of a beloved perennial with rosettes of bright red red flowers in terminal whorls. Special value to hummingbirds, butterflies, bumble bees and honey bees. 2'-3' tall. Blooms during summer months for 6 weeks. Tolerates full sun, but prefers wet meadows and moist open woods. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific name:** *Monarda fistulosa*

**Common Name:** Wild Bergamot

**Container Size:** #2 1-3'

**Price:** \$15.00

**Description:** Cultivated variety of a beloved perennial with rosettes of lavender flowers in terminal whorls. Special value to hummingbirds, butterflies, bumble bees and honey bees. 2'-3' tall. Blooms during summer months for 6 weeks. Tolerates full sun, but prefers wet meadows and moist open woods. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific name:** *Nuphar lutea*

**Common Name:** Yellow Pond lily

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Aquatic perennial with solitary yellow flowers that "smell like brandy". Leaves submerged, floating and emergent. Provides habitat and cover to fish, insects, and amphibians. Helps reduce gas build up in ponds. Prefer large, deep ponds (60cm) of still or slow-moving water using pockets, crates, or other means to contain the soil. Any soil type is fine. **Native To: South Jersey**

**Scientific name:** *Nymphaea odorata*

**Common Name:** American White lily

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Aquatic perennial with large, fragrant, white flowers. Leaves submerged, floating on surface or emergent. Provides habitat and cover to fish, insects, and amphibians. Plant the rhizome at the edge of the container so it can grow horizontally across the top. Barely cover the rhizomes with soil and place within 6-8 in. (15-20 cm) of the water surface until several new leaves have appeared. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Osmunda regalis*

**Common Name:** Royal Fern

**Container Size:** #1 6-24"

**Price:** \$15

**Description:** Tussock forming fern that can grow up to 6' tall. Spore mature mid-May to early June. Wet soils, shade to part sun. **Native To: Pine Barrens and South Jersey.**

**Scientific name:** *Peltandra virginica*

**Common Name:** Arrow arum

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Aquatic perennial aroid with long fleshy leaves. Produces a leaf-like spathe curled around a rod-like spadix that produces small inconspicuous flowers. Emergent leaves bring accent to ponds and bogs. Provides habitat and cover to fish, insects, and amphibians, and also perching for some birds that frequent ponds and bogs. Plant the rhizome in damp muddy soil or in up to 18 inches of water. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Pycnanthemum tenuifolium*

**Common Name:** Narrowleaf Mountain Mint

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Container Size:** #1 6-24"

**Description:** Easy to grow, minty aromatic foliage with silvery white tops. Tiny light pink-white flowers in clusters. Great for woodland borders. One of the best nectar sources for native butterflies. Attracts swarms of pollinators to your garden! 2'-3' tall. Flowers June-September. Moist to moderate well-drained soils. Sun to part shade. Deer resistant! **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific name:** *Ratibida pinnata*

**Common Name:** Yellow Coneflower

**Container Size:** #2 1-3'

**Price:** \$15.00

**Description:** Prairie Coneflower is a very versatile prairie native, thriving in a wide variety of soil types and moisture levels. Blooms from July to September, producing a wealth of deep yellow coneflowers with reflexed petals and prominent brown cones. The mature seeds are an excellent food for finches. **Native To: East Coast.**

**Scientific Name:** *Sorghastrum nutans*

**Common Name:** Indian Grass

**Container Size:** Quart

**Price:** \$5.00

**Description:** A tall, striking bunchgrass with beautiful plumes. Very tolerant of most site conditions. To 6'. Will grow in moist or dry soil. Semi-shade. Flowers mid August to mid-September. **Native To: South Jersey**

**Scientific Name:** *Symphotrichum novae-angliae*

**Common Name:** New England Aster

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Easily grown in average, medium, well-drained soils in full sun. Prefers moist, rich soil. Lavender, purple or blue flowers August - October. Pinching back the stems several times by mid-July will help control plant height, promote bushiness and relieve the need for staking. Attracts bees and butterflies. Somewhat drought tolerant. 3'-5' high. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Symphotrichum laeve*

**Common Name:** Smooth Blue Aster

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** The stout, leafy stem of this perennial grows 2-4 ft., with dark-green foliage that is smooth on top and rough underneath. The attractive and numerous pale-lavender flowers with yellow centers occur in large, open heads atop the stems. Sun loving and drought hardy. **Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.**

**Scientific Name:** *Symphotrichum oblongifolium*

**Common Name:** Aromatic Aster

**Container Size:** 2" Plug

**Price:** \$3.00

**Description:** Grows in bushy clusters, smaller of the asters available. Can grow in a variety of well-drained soils in full sun prefers moist, rich soil, tolerates high pH. Recommended gardens outside the pine barrens. Lavender, purple or blue flowers August - October. Attracts bees and butterflies. Somewhat drought tolerant. 1'-2' high. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Vernonia noveboracensis*

**Common Name:** New York Ironweed

**Container Size:** Quart

**Price:** \$5.00

**Description:** Great butterfly attractor with numerous tiny, fluffy, deep purple flowers in loose clusters atop stiff, leafy stems. Tolerates a wide range of soils, prefers medium to wet soils. 4'-8' tall. Full sun to part shade. **Native To: South Jersey.**

## TREES / SHRUBS / VINES

**Scientific Name:** *Acer rubrum*

**Common Name:** Red Maple

**Container Size:** Tubeling

**Price:** \$5.00

**Description:** Common in hardwood swamps, grows over 40' tall, blooms in the spring, produces impressive red leaves. This species prefers moist, acidic soils, but can tolerate a range of soil conditions. **Native To: South Jersey**

**Scientific Name:** *Arctostaphylos uva-ursi*

**Common Name:** Bearberry

**Container Size:** #1 6-24"

**Price:** \$15

**Description:** Ground-hugging understory shrub that produces pink to white flowers in April/May and berry-like red fruit that persists into winter. The nectar attracts hummingbirds, butterflies and bees and the berries provides food for wintering birds and small mammals. Prefers acid soil and sandy, well drained sites. Grows well in poor infertile soils. Full sun to partial shade. **Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.**

**Scientific Name:** *Celtis occidentalis*

**Common Name:** Common Hackberry

**Container Size:** #2 >3'

**Price:** \$15

**Description:** Extremely versatile tree that adapts to all conditions and requires little attention. Tolerates high winds and pollution and its oftentimes used in sidewalks and living fences to "shield" car fumes and noise in homes. Can grow to 40' tall or more if not trimmed properly. Full sun. **Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.**

**Scientific Name:** *Cornus racemosus*

**Common Name:** Gray Dogwood

**Container Size:** #2 >3'

**Price:** \$15

**Description:** Produces white clusters of white flowers in late May to early June followed by small, white, berry-like fruits, which attract many species of birds. The fruits are on top of branched, red twigs, which remain showy after the fruits have been consumed by the birds. Great butterfly attractant, provides habitat cover and shelter for wildlife. Tolerates poor and somewhat dry soils. Perfect for wildlife gardens, rain gardens and edges of ponds or streams. *Native To: South Jersey*

**Scientific Name:** *Diospyros virginiana*

**Common Name:** Common Persimmon

**Container Size:** #2 >3'

**Price:** \$15

**Description:** Small to medium tree growing between 35-60 feet. Produces yellow flowers April- June and edible fruit in the fall. Many insects visit the flowers and many species of wildlife feed on the fruit. Does well in part shade and both wet and dry sites. *Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens Periphery.*

**Scientific Name:** *Fagus grandifolia*

**Common Name:** American Beech

**Container Size:** #1 6-24"

**Price:** \$15

**Description:** Large deciduous tree with smooth, light-gray. Leaves turn a bronze in the fall and remain on the tree well into winter. Produces male and female yellow-green flowers that bloom April-May. Its ripen nuts are an important food source for wildlife in the fall. Mature trees used as nesting and roosting. Produces ample shade, great for a "natural cooling system" but can make it difficult to grow plants underneath, needs ample space to grow. *Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.*

**Scientific Name:** *Ilex verticillata*

**Common Name:** Winterberry Holly

**Container Size:** Tubeling

**Price:** \$5.00

**Description:** A holly with small white-green flowers in summer, attracts honeybees and butterflies. Fruits are bright red and provides food for wintering birds. Use in shrub borders and hedges. Common Winterberry is a good choice for wet sites, such as rain gardens and along ponds or streams. *Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.*

**Scientific Name:** *Kalmia latifolia*

**Common Name:** Mountain Laurel

**Container Size:** #2 1-3'

**Price:** \$45.00

**Description:** Cultivated variety of one of the the Pine Barrens most iconic flowers. It is a large shrub that can grow over 6' tall with white to pink flowers. Blooms in the summer. Moist, acidic soils. Grows best in partial shade. *Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.*

**Scientific Name:** *Lonicera sempervirens*

**Common Name:** Trumpet Honeysuckle

**Container Size:** Gallon

**Price:** \$16.00

**Description:** Slender, high-climbing vine with evergreen leaves. Flowers trumpet-shaped, red on the outside, yellow on the inside. A favorite among hummingbirds! Ornamental bright red berries in fall. Great for trellis or wall climbing. 3'-20' long. Blooms March - June. Sun to part shade; moist soils preferred. *Native To: South Jersey.*

**Scientific Name:** *Magnolia virginiana*

**Common Name:** Sweetbay Magnolia

**Container Size:** #2 12-36"

**Price:** \$18

**Description:** Small tree with showy, aromatic white flowers. Semi-evergreen leaves and brilliant red ornamental fruit. Spicy, aromatic leaves. 10'-30' tall. Blooms mid-June. Wet to moist acidic soils. Prefers full sun but tolerates partial shade. *Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.*

**Scientific Name:** *Nyssa silvatica*

**Common Name:** Black Gum

**Container Size:** #2 >3'

**Price:** \$20.00

**Description:** Separate male and female trees produce small white flowers in May-June. Both flowers produces nectar that attracts pollinators, and fruits are a preferred food source for migrating and resident birds in the fall. It offers showy, red color in fall. Its medium-high wind resistance tolerates different soil types and wet/dry conditions. It is somewhat salt tolerant. *Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.*

**Scientific Name:** *Photina melanocarpa*

**Common Name:** Black Chokeberry

**Container Size:** #1 18-24"

**Price:** \$12

**Description:** Shrub with smooth leaf surfaces. Found in forested wetlands and shrub bogs. White to pink flowers on smooth stalks develop into 1/4" black fruits. 5'-10' high. Can grow in wet or dry areas. Prefers partial shade. Flood tolerant. **Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens. Available:**

**Scientific Name:** *Physocarpus opulifolius*

**Common Name:** Common Ninebark

**Container Size:** #1 18-24"

**Price:** \$12

**Description:** Medium sized shrub, that produces clusters of pinkish-white flowers in May-June and showy red fruits in the summer. Excellent wildlife attractant. The name comes from its "many layers" of bark. Thrives in a variety of soil conditions and drought levels. **Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.**

**Scientific Name:** *Pinus rigida*

**Common Name:** Pitch Pine

**Container Size:** #2 2-3'

**Price:** \$18

**Description:** The characteristic Pine Barrens tree. Large when grown on good sites and protected from fire, scrubby and flat topped when burned. Equally at home on both dry sites and in wetlands. 40'-60' tall. Likes sunny conditions. **Native To: Pine Barrens.**

**Scientific Name:** *Prunus maritima*

**Common Name:** Beach Plum

**Container Size:** #2

**Price:** \$18

**Description:** Salt tolerant, medium size, rounded shrub of the outer coastal plain. Attractive white flowers; its fruit is prized for making jams. To 6' tall. Flowers late April to May. Fruits early September to October. Grows in moist or dry sandy conditions and likes sun. **Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.**

**Scientific Name:** *Quercus phellos*

**Common Name:** Willow oak

**Container Size:** #2

**Price:** \$15.00

**Description:** the same tree produces separate male and female flowers (catkins) in spring that attract bees, produces the typical acorns that birds and wildlife depends on in the fall and winter. It has cascading, narrow, willow-like leaves, which turn yellow, bronze-orange, yellow-brown, or russet-red in fall. Adult trees provide nesting area for birds and habitat for wildlife in general. Tolerates a wide range of soil conditions and can be used a street tree or shade tree. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Rosa virginiana*

**Common Name:** Virginia Rose

**Container Size:** Tubeling

**Price:** \$5.00

**Description:** Deciduous rose 1-3' tall (less frequently to 6') and spreading 5-10'. Blooms in spring to early summer with fragrant and attractive pink flowers with a yellow center. Attracts birds and butterflies! Best grown in medium to wet, well-drained soil in full sun. Water roots deeply on summer mornings. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Spiraea alba var. latifolia*

**Common Name:** White Meadowsweet/Broad Meadowseet

**Container Size:** Tubeling

**Price:** \$5.00

**Description:** Woody shrub in the rose/apple family that can grow 3-6' in height and width. Produces white-pinkish fragrant flowers june through september that attracts bees and butterflies. Prefers moist conditions and full sun. Thrives in sandy, loamy soils. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Thelypteris palustris*

**Common Name:** Marsh fern

**Container Size:** Tubeling

**Price:** \$5.00

**Description:** Perennial fern that thrives in moist, sunny environments but also tolerates shade. Does well in sandy, loamy or clay soils. Forms large thickets if allowed to grow freely. **Native To: South Jersey.**

**Scientific Name:** *Vaccinium angustifolium*

**Common Name:** Lowbush Blueberry

**Container Size:** Tubeling

**Price:** \$5.00

**Description:** Small shrub at home in acidic lowlands. A plant for all seasons with attractive flowers, tasty fruit, scarlet fall foliage & red winter stem color. Fruits early July to early August. To 4' tall. Likes moist soils but with some irrigation can also be grown on drier sites. Sun, partial shade, shade. **Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.**

**Scientific Name:** *Vaccinium corymbosum*
