Judge's Statement by Robert Zurfluh

Thank you to the Pinelands Preservation Alliance and everyone involved in putting together this wonderful event. It was an honor to view the 82 stunning photographs on display in this beautiful building and to spend about 2 hours picking the award recipients. It is my understanding that only about 10% of all submitted images were selected to be on display here. Congratulations to all makers who have their artworks exhibited here. They are all outstanding. Picking only about a quarter of all the works on display was not an easy task, and I would like to take a moment to highlight the winners in each group in this written statement.

1st Place - Open - Image #7 - Oswego Choices by by John Dolph

This image has many qualities going for it. As the viewer I see myself drawn into this quiet scene with the three kayaks exploring the Pinelands. I feel as though I become part of this group joining them in their outing. The image gives us a perspective of the pinelands that is not far from home, but often remains unseen.

1st Place & Best in Show - Flora and Fauna - Image # 34 - Nature's Miracles by Daniel D'Auria MD

When we photograph animals, we want to capture their eyes. To make the image even better, we want to capture highlights in their eyes. To make the image even better than that we want the animal to do something interesting and maybe even interact with another animal. And then of course everything needs to be sharp (no matter how fast those animals move) and we want a pleasing background too. And, to top it all off, the image overall needs to have an impact on the viewer. *Nature's Miracles* has all of this. Freezing this moment in time – perfectly timed, with the wonderful color combination of the blue bird feeding its young, having a separation between the birds, and having the sharp eye with the highlight, made this image not only my choice as the winning image in this category, but also overall.
