## HERBACEOUS / PERENNIALS

Scientific Name: Eragrostis spectabilis

Common Name: Purple Love GrassContainer Size: 2" PlugPrice: \$3Description: Warm-season grass with small reddish-purple flowers that bloom in July-August. Dried flowers can<br/>be used for fall flower arrangements. Flowers are attractive to bees and butterflies. Does better in hot, dry, full sun<br/>conditions. Does not tolerate wet sites or shade. Perfect for butterfly gardens and wildlife habitat areas.<br/>Native To: South Jersey.

#### Scientific Name: Juncus effusus

Common Name: Soft rushContainer Size: 2" PlugPrice: \$3Description: Blooms July through September. Clump forming, flower blooming, grass-like rush reaching 3' in<br/>height. Stems are unbranched and round in cross section. Has the potential to create dense stands with deep fibrous<br/>root systems. Great for use as shoreline protection. Capable of filtering suspended solids, and up-taking excess<br/>nutrients. Persists through polluted conditions. *Native To: South Jersey.* 

## Scientific Name: Eupatorium Maculatum

Common Name: Spotted Joe-Pye WeedContainer Size: 2" plugPrice: \$3Description: Perennial with narrow leaves, growing in whorls of three or four around the stem, purple/ purplespotted flowers bloom in late July to October, forming nice bunches at top. Prefers dry open areas with sandy soilsand good drainage. Flowers are attractive to bees and butterflies. Native To: South Jersey.

Scientific Name: Solidago bicolorCommon Name: Silver rodContainer Size: QuartPrice: \$15Description: Blooms in late summer with a flat cluster on silver/white flowers sitting on top of this herbaceous<br/>perennial. Prefers full sun and moist soil but can tolerate drought conditions. Up to 3' tall and less susceptible to<br/>powdery mildew than some other species of goldenrods. Native To: South Jersey.

Scientific Name: Iris versicolorContainer Size: 2" PlugPrice: \$3Common Name: Blueflag IrisContainer Size: QuartPrice: \$15Description: This iris has attractive blue to purple flowers and blooms May - July. From 2' to 3' tall. Grows in<br/>medium to wet soils in full sun to partial shade. Can grow in 2"-4" in shallow standing water. Does best in full sun<br/>and moist, rich soils. Will spread by self-seeding and extension of rhizomes. Native To: South Jersey.

Scientific name: Peltandra virginicaCommon Name: Arrow arumContainer Size: 2" PlugPrice: \$3Description: Aquatic perennial aroid with long fleshy leaves. Produces a leaf-like spathe curled around a rod-like spadix that produces small inconspicuous flowers. Emergent leaves bring accent to ponds and bogs. Provides habitat and cover to fish, insects, and amphibians, and also perching for some birds that frequent ponds and bogs. Plant the rhizome in damp muddy soil or in up to 18 inches of water. Native To: South Jersey.

Flowers June-September. Moist to moderately well-drained soils. Sun to part<br/>shade. Deer resistant! Native To: South Jersey.

#### Scientific Name: Kalmia latifolia "Olympic Fire" Common Name: Mountain Laurel "Olympic Fire" **Container Size: #5**

**Price**: \$30 **Description:** Variety of Mountain Laurel with amazing red buds that pop open to reveal white to light pink flowers, creating a great contrast. Grows well in full sun to part shade in cool, moist, well-drained, acidic soil. Blooms early through mid-summer. Up to 4-5' tall. Native To: South Jersey & Pine Barrens

### Scientific Name: Kalmia latifolia "Carol"

Common Name: Mountain Laurel "Carol" **Container Size: #5 Price:** \$30 Description: Very compact variety of Mountain Laurel at just 3-4' tall. Summer blooms are red in bud and pinkish-red in flower. Full sun to part shade; moist, well-drained soils. Native To: South Jersey & Pine Barrens

Common Name: Mountain Laurel Pink Charm **Container Size: #5 Price:** \$30 **Description:** Deep pink buds open to rich pink flowers with a narrow dark pink ring near the base of the corolla. Ideal for a lightly shaded, woodland setting, providing year-round protection for birds. Native To: South Jersey & Pine Barrens

Scientific Name: Rhododendron 'Maximum Roseum' **Common Name:** Great Laurel

Container Size: #7 18-24" **Price:** \$40 Description: This broadleaf evergreen shrub has clusters of white to purplish-pink flowers that bloom in June, providing a valued food source for bumblebees. Use Great Laurel in shrub borders, foundation plantings, and natural areas around your yard. Shade to partial shade. Native To: South Jersey

#### Scientific Name: Rhododendron 'Nova Zembla'

**Price:** \$40 Common Name: Evergreen Rhododendron Container Size: #7 18-24" Description: A popular and attractive broadleaf evergreen shrub with rich red flowers in spring and an upright rounded habit, quite hardy, good in partial shade; must have well-drained, highly acidic and organic soil, use plenty of peat moss when planting. Native To: South Jersey

Scientific Name: Rhododendron 'Roseum Elegans' Container Size: #7 18-24" **Price:** \$40 Common Name: Rosem Rhododendron **Description:** This vigorous-growing, medium sized evergreen shrub is valued for its large rose-lilac colored flowers that bloom in the late spring months. These plants will perform best on north or east facing slopes, and prefer partial shade. It's an outstanding choice for shrub or mixed borders, woodland gardens, and shade gardens. Native To: South Jersev

## Scientific Name: Aronia arbutifolia 'Brilliantissima'

Scientific Name: Ilex glabra

**Common Name:** Brilliant Red Chokeberry Container Size: #5 30-36" **Price:** \$40 **Description:** Aronia arbutifolia 'Brilliantissima' is a deciduous shrub with white flowers in May. The bright red fruit of this Red Chokeberry ripens in late summer and persists into winter. The glossy foliage turns brilliant red in fall. This cultivar differs from the species; it is more compact, produces larger and more numerous fruit plus has superior red fall color. It forms a suckering colony and is wet tolerant. Full sunlight. Native To: South Jersey

**Common Name:** Inkberry Holly **Container Size:** #1 Description: A holly with small white-green flowers in summer, attracts honeybees and butterflies. Fruits are deep purple (or ink color) and provides fodd for wintering birds. Use in shrub borders and hedges. It is a good choice for wet sites, such as rain gardens and along ponds or streams. Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.

**Price:** \$25 Common Name: Black Gum **Container Size:** #2 >3' **Description:** Separate male and female trees produce small white flowers in May-June. Both flowers produces nectar that attracts pollinators, and fruits are a preferred food source for migrating and resident birds in the fall. It offers showy, red color in fall. Its medium-high wind resistance tolerates different soil types and wet/dry conditions. It is somewhat salt tolerant. Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.

#### Scientific Name: Pinus rigida

Common Name: Pitch Pine **Container Size:** #2 **Price:** \$15 **Description:** The characteristic Pine Barrens tree. Large when grown on good sites and protected from fire, scrubby and flat topped when burned. Equally at home on both dry sites and in wetlands. 40'-60' tall. Likes sunny conditions. Native To: Pine Barrens.

#### Scientific Name: Quercus phellos

Common Name: Willow oak **Container Size: #2 Description:** the same tree produces separate male and female flowers (catkins) in spring that attract bees, produces the typical acorns that birds and wildlife depends on in the fall and winter. It has cascading, narrow, willow-like leaves, which turn yellow, bronze-orange, yellow-brown, or russet-red in fall. Adult trees provide nesting area for birds and habitat for wildlife in general. Tolerates a wide range of soil conditions and and can be used a street tree or shade tree. Native To: South Jersey.

#### Scientific Name: Spiraea latifolia

**Common Name:** White Meadowseet **Container Size:** #1 **Price:** \$15 **Description:** Woody shrub in the rose/apple family that can grow 3-6' in height and width. Produces white-pinkish fragrant flowers June through September that attracts bees and butterflies. Prefers moist conditions and full sun. Thrives in sandy, loamy soils. Native To: South Jersey.

#### Scientific Name: Vaccinium angustifolium

**Common Name:** Lowbush Blueberry **Container Size:** Tubeling 6-10" **Price:** \$5 **Description:** Small shrub at home in acidic lowlands. A plant for all seasons with attractive flowers, tasty fruit, scarlet fall foliage & red winter stem color. Fruits early July to early August. To 4' tall. Likes moist soils but with some irrigation can also be grown on drier sites. Sun, partial shade, shade. Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.

#### Scientific Name: Vaccinium corymbosum

**Common Name:** Highbush Blueberry Container Size: #1 6-24" **Price:** \$15 **Description:** Medium tall shrub at home in acidic lowlands. A plant for all seasons with attractive flowers, tasty fruit, scarlet fall foliage & red winter stem color. Fruits early July to early August. To 12' tall. Likes moist soils but with some irrigation can also be grown on drier sites. Sun, partial shade, shade. Native To: South Jersey and Pine Barrens.

#### Scientific Name: Viburnum trilobum

Common Name: Cranberry Viburnum Container Size: #1 18-24" **Description:** Dense, rounded, multi-stemmed shrub with showy white flowers that produces cluster of red showy berries. Ornamental and useful to birds. Blooms May-June. 6'-12' tall. Prefers moist soils and partial shade. Native To: New Jersev.
